TVCJ founding member Jacky Poulsen is leading a drive to collect Wheels bus tickets to distribute to the homeless and others in the area who are struggling financially.

One of the big challenges for people in poverty is transportation. They often don't own a

vehicle, and taking public transportation is \$2 per trip, which means a visit to Open Heart Kitchen for a 'free meal' actually costs them \$4 in transportation. And it's the same for getting to medical appointments and other services. So over the holiday season, Jacky is reaching out to the community to collect as many tickets as possible. They will be distributed to those most in need at Open Heart Kitchen as well as Livermore Homeless Refuge.

Livermore Amador Valley Transit Authority (they run Wheels buses) have offered to match 50 cents on the dollar for every donation. So our donations
