

Sophia's impressions of the seder....her favorite seder plate food is the orange, she liked looking for the afikomen and she said the dinner and dessert were yummy!



Reclaim the Records is a not-for-profit group filing the Freedom of Information requests to get "off limits" genealogy records released back to the public and put online for free. Light kosher refreshments will be served. Everyone interested is welcome to attend.

Jewish Cultural School (JCS)

This year our Jewish Cultural School theme is Jews in the Art World. We learned about Sonia Delaunay an artist known for her bold colors and geometric shapes. Sonia Delaunay's life touched so many Jewish events in modern history. She was born into the thriving Secular Jewish world in Odessa, home of Yiddish and Hebrew writers and the early Zionist movements. As a girl, she moved to St. Petersburg during a time that few Jews were allowed in major Russian cities. She studied art abroad and did not want to return to the Russian empire after the pogroms of 1903-1905, so she moved to Paris, which was the center of artistic life, and

home to many Jewish artists. She survived the second world war in Free France.

After learning about Jewish history through the life of Sonia Delaunay, the students created art based on her techniques.
