
Jamie Ireland is graduating from the Leadership Program of the International Institute for Secular Humanistic Judaism. Members are invited to come celebrate.

Ariel Vegosen from Keshet on October 22nd. Ariel talked with the kids about why Jews should care about the rights of other minorities and a little bit about the history of Jews in the movement for equal rights for LGBTQ people. After the kids heard the story of Jewish astronomer Frank Kameny, who was fired from a government job for being gay and went on to found a gay-rights organization, they wrote postcards to AG Sessions objecting to his determination that it is legal to fire people for being gay. Ariel comes from a secular Jewish background which informed her social conscience, as it does ours. She explained her work with Keshet and another organization, Gender Illumination, as "teaching people to be nice."

We also made delicious mandelbrot (sweet almond bread). Here's the recipe:

Mandelbrot

Cream together a cup of butter (or butter substitute), a quarter cup of vegetable shortening, and a cup and a half of sugar.

Add four eggs and stir.

Add four cups of flour and one teaspoon of baking powder and stir.

Add a teaspoon of vanilla and one cup of slivered almonds.

Form loaves about 2 inches wide on a cookie sheet. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes. Cut them warm, lay the slices on their sides and brown them in the oven (about 10 minutes.)
