

Lafayette Reservoir Nature Rim Trail



The Jewish Dog By Asher Kravitz



This is a novel that presents the holocaust from the point of view of a dog. Caleb is a dog that is born into the house of a German Jewish family in the mid 1930s. He is an unusually bright and perceptive dog that has come to understand the language of humans.

He is adopted by a German family and becomes a military dog. He is employed at a concentration camp and observes the inhumanity therein. Caleb develops qualities of loyalty, empathy and understanding. He has qualities that we would love to see in a dog, as well as in humans. His unique insights into the human condition are enlightening and profound. Reading about him almost makes me want another dog...almost.
