


# BOOK REVIEW THE TATTOOIST OF AUSCHWITZ By Heather Morris

This novel is based on a screenplay written by the author. It tells the true story of Lale who is a prisoner in the concentration camp of Auschwitz. Here he meets and falls in love with Gita, a fellow prisoner. Lale becomes the chief Tattooist and is in charge of tattooing numbers on the arms of new prisoners. Because of this position he is given some special privileges, but he is still a prisoner. Through his eyes we see the horrors of the camp, as well as loyalty and generosity of the prisoners.

While the book is uncomfortable to read at times, it tells of the spirit and determination to survive at all costs. Although we may have read many stories of the holocaust, I would recommend this book because it brings us a unique view of life during this terrible period.
