## Habonim Dror Camp Gilboa





Last weekend, <u>Tri-Valley students</u> were joined by counselors from Habonim Dror Camp Gilboa. Together they explored Jewish ethics around food and consumption.

The activity started with teams of students designing their own restaurant, each based on a different Jewish value - respect for animals and avoidance of suffering, not ruining or needlessly destroying, and not oppressing workers. Each team created a TV advertisement showing off their restaurant and how its operation reflected their value.

From there, teams participated in an Iron Chef pizza competition to design the most ethical pizza! Teams were asked to think about different values as they designed, such as how the workers are treated, if there is any harm to the environment, if the ingredients include animal products, and how wasteful the packaging is.

This activity was a "taste of" Gilboa's experiential camp activities that focus on community building, social justice, and Jewish values-based education. Though Camp Gilboa does offer all the regular camp activities (such as archery, swimming, arts and crafts, electives, etc.), the focus is on educational (and fun) experiences that sharpen critical thinking skills, engage kids in intellectual discussion and infuse them with an understanding of themselves and a sense of responsibility to the community.


#### International Women's Day March 8th, 2019
