






BOOK REVIEW

THE YID By Paul Goldberg



This book is a historical novel set in Russia in the 1940's and 1950's. It starts when Russia government soldiers try to arrest our main character, who is an army veteran and actor in the old Jewish Theater. After this failed attempt he assembles a small group of characters that concoct a plot to assassinate Stalin.

The group consists of a former machine gunner in the Red Army who becomes a prominent surgeon, an African American who came to the USSR to build smelters and became an engineer, and a young lady who had a score to settle. They all speak English, Yiddish and Russian. (Translations follow immediately) This unlikely group, along with some other interesting characters, carry out their plot with violent as well as humorous consequences.

I found the book interesting, but somewhat confusing because at times it changes between their actual words and the lines in a Shakespearean play that they are acting out simultaneously. You can purchase this book on Amazon by <u>clicking on this</u>
