
BOOK REVIEW

My Train to Freedom:

A Jewish Boy's Journey From Nazi Germany to a Life of Activism

This is a memoir of the author who grew up in a Secular Jewish home, and as a boy escaped the holocaust by being part of the Kindertransport project organized by Sir Nicholas Winton, a young London stockbroker. The author was one of 669 Czechoslovakian children who were brought to England by these trains thus saving their lives. The book recounts his narrow escape from Czechoslovakia, his life in England and his trip to America.

Throughout his life he always asked the question, "why was I saved and others perished in the Holocaust?" To help answer this question, he lived a life full of activism for humanitarian causes and projects, which were dedicated to promoting peace and freedom. While in England he received an education at a Christian boarding school. Because, he was strongly influenced by his Christian teachers, he considered himself both Christian and Jewish.

In my opinion, too much of the main body of the book contained only mildly interesting retelling of family history. However, the final appendices tell of his relatives' experiences in the concentration camps and on the forced death marches. These accounts were very graphic.
