
Redwood Regional Park Oakland Hike

Date: Saturday, February 22nd, 2020

Time: 10:00 am

Distance: 3.9 miles, Elevation gain: 682

West Ridge, Tres Sendas Stream Trail, and <u>East Ridge Loop</u>. We'll start on the West Ridge Trail and follow for it 1 mile to Tres Sendas Trail., Then turn right onto the Stream Trail and follow it for 0.3 miles to Prince Trail and turn left. Prince Trail goes 0.5 miles to East Ridge Trail, where we'll turn left and follow it back to the trailhead. The ladybugs migrate here in November and stay until late winter – around the end of February. So I'm hopeful we'll get to see lots of ladybugs on this hike.



Park at the Main Parking lot on Skyline Blvd, which is 2 miles north of Chabot Space and Science Center.






BOOK REVIEW

Becoming Eve

My Journey from Ultra-Orthodox Rabbi to

Transgender Woman

by Abby Stein



A young Abby Stein knew her religion was not teaching her the truth when she realized that her religion did not accept her truth – that she was girl. Her actual identity as a girl was not accepted, not allowed, even as her perceived identity as a male Talmud scholar was lauded. Her memoir gives fascinating – and sometimes horrifying – insight into the Hassidic community into which she was born and the relationships among the various Hassidic dynasties while tracing her explorations into Jewish mysticism to explain her "female soul in a male body." Eventually, she comes to the conclusion that she must live as an atheist woman, a decision that costs her most of her family and community. She is now active in support groups for those leaving the Ultra-Orthodox communities and for transgender Jews. Becoming Eve is an engrossing and heart-wrenching story.
