## Khukat-Balak

This July 4th is the Torah reading Khukat-Balak. The Haftarah for Balak, Micah 5:6 – 6:8 is most famous for the very last verse – Do justice . . .love goodness . . .walk modestly with your god. But this year, an earlier verse is much more apposite. It reads "The remnant of Jacob shall be among the nations, in the midst of the many peoples, like a lion among beasts of the wild, like a fierce lion among flocks of sheep, which tramples wherever it goes and rends with none to deliver."

You could, of course, use this to justify the annexation of the West Bank and the trampling

of the rights of those who live there. But the beauty and joy of interpreting Jewish texts is that they can be read so many different ways. Here's how I read it:


Just as the American colonists were a small but lionhearted band who triumphed over the British – that's what we celebrate on July 4th – a small number of people today who are willing to be seen, to be heard, to fight for what's right, can also win. Those who have hearts of lions can triumph over those who, like sheep, know only how to follow the one who sets himself up as leader. The lion does not nicely ask the sheep if it would like to be eaten. It doesn't bargain for a leg of lamb or maybe a tasty chop, leaving the rest intact. It demands its due. Those who care about justice and goodness can prevail – but only if we roar like lions.

## Nobody Will Tell You This But Me By Bess Kalb



This book is a memoir of the author (who is a writer for the Jimmy Kimmel show) and an account of the relationship between her and her grandmother. This relationship was extremely close, loving, funny, and, at times, brutally honest. It was recalled by the author's memory, as well as reports by her mother and grandfather. It was also documented by frequent voicemail exchanges between the author and grandmother.

This relationship continued even after the grandmother's death, in the imagined conversations between the two. Many of us would be envious of the closeness of the

relationship, and of the communication and bond that was developed.
