

Cost: FREE


The Zoom meeting link will be sent closer to the date.


In Their Footsteps: Memories of an Immigrant's Child by Pearl Lipsky Krupit

A charming and educational account of the life of a Jewish child in the Bronx, her family's story and her journey to her roots. The author's memories are vivid and evocative of the time, the 1930's and 1940's of her childhood, and the years after. She includes her quest for family stories and the sometimes unsatisfactory answers she received. (Upon asking her mother why one of her uncles drowned, she received the

response "Because he couldn't swim.") Suitable for any age.

BOOK REVIEW

Son of Hamas: A Gripping Account of Terror, Betrayal, Political Intrigue, and Unthinkable Choices By Mosab Hassan Yousef



This the true story of Mosab Hassan Yousef, who is the son of one of the founders of Hamas. Because his father is beloved and respected by Hamas, Mosab is given special treatment by this militant group. It was expected that he would eventually inherit his father's leadership position. However, Mosab becomes disenchanted with Hamas and decides to work with Shin Bet, the Israeli intelligence organization. He becomes a double agent, reporting on Hamas' activities and thus saving many Israeli lives.

His main goal is to help achieve peace in the Middle East. Unfortunately, (in my opinion) he comes to this objective due to his embrace of the teachings of Jesus Christ. Especially the idea of "Love thy enemy". In my

view, he could have gotten there also if he embraced humanism.

This book reads like a thriller, and is a real page turner. However, I could have done without the religious references.
