



BOOK REVIEW NIGHT ANGELS BY

#### **WEINA DAI RANDEL**



This novel tells the story of Feng Shan Ho, his wife Grace, and their son Monto. Dr. Ho held the position of Counsel General of the Republic of China during World War II. The story takes place mostly in Vienna, Austria.

At one point the Jews of Vienna are told by the Nazi government that they cannot emigrate from the country. Grace convinces Dr. Ho that all Jews that cannot leave will probably face execution. Of course, there is a frantic effort to obtain exit visas. Dr. Ho is the only person who is authorized to write these visas. At the risk of losing his position and possibly his life and that of his family, Dr. Ho hand writes thousands of visas. He thus comes under grave threat from his ambassador, the Nazi representative, and the local police directing him to quit issuing the visas to the thousands of Jews who line up at the door of his embassy. This decision has a profound effect on his life and that of his family.

This book illustrates the life and death struggles of the Austrian Jews to leave their country in the face of execution. It also illustrates the incredible courage of those Jews and gentiles that risked their lives to help them. Even though this book is well written and exciting, I have to warn you that parts of it, which tell of the brutality of the Nazis, are difficult and unpleasant to read. 
