Rosh Hashanah Family Day--9/10/23







BOOK REVIEW THE BOY WHO LOVED ANNE FRANK BY

ELLEN FELDMAN



This is a work of historical fiction that tells the story of a boy who Anne Frank might have met while she was in hiding from the Nazis. It tells about what happened to him after the war and after Anne was killed in the concentration camp.

This young man, Peter Van Pels, spent a good part of his life running away from his past and denying his Jewish religion, to the point where he almost had his concentration camp numbers surgically removed. The conflicts he had, stayed with him even after relocating to America and becoming a successful businessman, a husband and a father.

The story goes on to tell about what happened to the Anne Frank's diary after it became a successful movie and a play. As you can imagine, nothing comes easy.

This book was extremely well written. Most of the time it was hard to tell whether you were reading history or fiction. I definitely recommend it to all who want a picture of what life was like for Jews who emigrated from Nazi Germany to America post WWII.
