

#### BOOK REVIEW MOONGLOW BY MICHAEL CHABON



This is the story of Michael Chabon's grandfather. He was a rocket designer, model maker and enthusiast. He married a holocaust survivor who had very deep emotional scars from her experiences in the concentration camps.

The grandfather had an obsession of finding and talking to Verner Von Braun to tell him what he thought of his rockets, which were used as weapons of war. Grandfather's rockets were to be used for settlement of the moon primarily for Jewish people. They finally meet and develop an interesting relationship.

The book also tells the compelling stories of Chabon's parents, siblings and other relatives.

While these stories are interesting and dramatic, they may not be totally biographical. The main issue I have with this book is that it is written in a somewhat scattered style and is sometimes hard to follow. Having said this, I would highly recommend the book. It gives a great picture of the post -World War II America and of the race to develop rockets. <u>If you are interested in purchasing this book, then you can find it on Amazon by clicking here</u>.
