


Board Meeting Updates Teen Group update


Open Position: Eden Interfaith Representative

Marilyn is a young woman growing up in New Jersey. Father is a religious Jew. Mother is a house wife. Marilyn is strong willed and eager to learn about life. When she and a young man from the temple, the Rabbi's son, are caught in an indelicate position at the temple, the embarrassed parents decide to send her to live with her great aunt Ada who is wealthy and cantankerous, in order to "straighten her out" and to fix her up with a nice Jewish husband. Since Ada is a professional matchmaker, this should have been a perfect arrangement. What could go wrong?

In the first place, we see that Marilyn has no desire to get married, but instead would like to be a writer. At first, she and Ada butt heads. Marilyn is headstrong and wants to be free. They soon learn to help and care about each other. Many issues complicate the lives of the characters. The characters are well developed and relatable.
