What is your "happy place" in nature? This class was all about Tu B'Shvat and included a delicious fruit and nut couscous, and ecology resolutions.






Tu B'Shvat 1/20/24

# BOOK REVIEW THE HEAVEN AND EARTH GROCERY STORE By James McBride



This novel takes place in Pottstown Pennsylvania in the middle 1900s. The town that the story takes place is called Chicken Hill. Its residents are made up of Jewish immigrants, Blacks, and other ethnic immigrants. Each group brings with it its various prejudices and ethnic misconceptions.

Their struggle becomes (not always successfully) to live together in this small town.

One of the plots in the book is about two residents who dig a well in an open field of the town. At the bottom of the well they find a mezuzah and other religious items. Then these well diggers are sealed in the well by a hurricane. The mystery becomes who put the items in the well and why was the well being dug in the first place.

Another central plot to this story concerns a deaf boy they call Dodo. He witnesses an attack on the beloved town matriarch, Chona, by the town doctor who is a leader of the local KKK. In order to conceal this crime, the doctor has Dodo committed to an insane asylum. The story goes on from there with a number of diverse characters and plot twists.

The story gets very complex and wordy but ends up in a quite satisfactory manner. The book is very well written though more complex than it has to be.
