

One of our amazing teachers shared a deeply personal story from her family's history, connecting us to the hardships of being trapped by World War I—a story that


resonates with Chagall's own experiences.

Book Review The Air Raid Book Club By Annie Lyons



This historical novel takes place in London during the time of World War II. The main characters are a book shop owner, Gertie and a German Jewish girl, Hedy. Hedy's parents foresaw the terrible danger that lie ahead in Germany, so in order to protect

her they send her to London. Here she is reluctantly taken in by Gertie, who is a recent widow.

Shortly after the German bombing of London, Hedy suggests that the community capitalize on their love of books and their boredom and anxiety in the local bomb shelter. She suggests that they start a book club. This club serves to allay their fears and brings their community together in the face of deadly and destructive bombings.

Gertie and Hedy become beloved leaders in the community in spite of their own losses and tragedies. The characters in this book are warm, heroic and compelling. Therefore, I would heartily recommend this book to all.
