#### **Directions: Directions to Arroyo Road Staging Area**

From I-580 in Livermore, exit at North Livermore Avenue. Drive south on North Livermore Avenue. Turn right at Portola Avenue, then left on North L Street. North L Street becomes South L Street, then Arroyo Road. Continue on Arroyo Road past the entrance to the U.S. Veterans Administration Hospital and Sycamore Grove Park. The staging area is on the left at the end of Arroyo Road (No parking fee).

**Alternatively**, take Holmes St. in Livermore to Wetmore Rd. Continue past Sycamore Grove entrance to Arroyo Road. Turn right and proceed as above.



### Save the Date for Rosh Hashanah - 9/22/25




Celebrate Rosh Hashanah with Tri-Valley Cultural Jews Monday, Sept. 22 – Livermore, CA



### **BOOK REVIEW**

Tablets Shattered: The End of an American Jewish Century and the Future of Jewish Life

### By JOSHUA LEIFER



The following is a non-fiction book that discusses the future of Jews in America and Israel. The author is a conservative and a mildly observant Jew. He starts with Jews coming to America and Israel after the holocaust.

He focuses on how America has changed Jewish thinking: religiously, economically, and culturally. In the European shtetlach the religion was orthodox. There was no choice. Life centered around torah and dictates of the rabbis. In America choices were infinite and based on what one could achieve.

Similarly, American schools featured secular education. Formerly European children were lost, no matter how intelligent and hard working they were. Language was a major issue here—from primarily Yiddish to English.

In Israel the emphasis was learning what was good for the group as opposed to what was important for the individual. New Americans had to adjust to the new way of thinking if they were to be successful. Those who chose not to adapt in America settled in isolated Jewish communities. The author laments that the former way of thinking began to crumble in both America and Israel. Jews here formed a number of organizations designed to provide support for Jewish refugees. Eventually, many of these organizations failed because they were not compatible with the more modern life styles.

Israel also went through many changes. It went from an idealized Jewish state concerned with helping its residents into becoming what many see as a pariah on the

world stage. Now many feel that its war with Hamas has changed Israel's focus. As is true with many Israelis, as well as Americans, their feelings are in conflict here.

I feel that this is an extremely well written book. It is very important for all of us to read it, regardless of which form of Judaism you subscribe to. If you would like to purchase this book at Barnes and Noble click here.
