
Jewish Culture School Update--Jews Who Fought for LGBTQ+ Rights

This book is both historical fiction and fantasy. It takes place in New York City post World War II. An Irish boy becomes friends with the rabbi of a small synagogue. He reluctantly agrees to become the "Shabbos Goy" for the shul because the rabbi cannot find anyone else to do the job. In the process the boy agrees to teach the rabbi about American customs, such as baseball. The rabbi, in exchange, agrees to teach the boy about Yiddish and Jewish customs. And about the city of Prague, where the Rabbi was born. They become unlikely best friends.

The main obstacle to this friendship is the antisemitic and violent gang who controls the neighborhood. The leader of this gang commits a violent act against another older Jew. The boy witnesses this act. He is threatened by the gang leader with terrible violence if he ever tells the police.

The book describes the antisemitism of the time, as well as the good will of many of the residents. It also contains an element of fantasy involving the creature called the Golem. It is a page turner that I thoroughly enjoyed and would highly recommend.
